STEROIDS





Sudden extreme muscle growth; wild, sometimes violent, mood swings; missing money; a sudden change in appearance and/or attitude; unexplained absences; change in friends

SHORT AND LONG-TERM EFFECTS

Short-term (men and women): increased muscle size, depression, mood swings, paranoia

Long-term (men and women): stunted growth, kidney damage, liver damage, heart problems, high blood pressure, high cholesterol

Long-term (men): decreased size of testicles, reduced sperm count, baldness, developing breasts, infertility

Long-term (women): baldness, growing facial hair, problems with menstrual cycle, development of a deeper voice, infertility

Injected or swallowed in pill form

WHY IT'S DANGEROUS

Steroids pose a serious risk to the user's health. They may cause permanent damage to the heart, liver, and kidneys. They are also extremely harmful to a person's reproductive system, and they may cause infertility. Also, steroids have been know to cause severe mood swings called "roid rage," where the user may suddenly become very angry without any reason. There is also an increased chance of developing paranoia and depression.
